

Maths Lesson: 31 Making Shapes
 You will need:

- Blu tack or dough
- 12 lolly sticks or 12 straws or 12 pieces of card the same length

What shapes can you make?
 2d and 3d?

Maths Lesson: 32 Halve the shapes
 Use pictures of food.
 Cut the food shapes into 2 pieces the same/into half.

Maths Lesson: 33 Find half
 Get 2 toys and
 2 apples
 4 biscuits
 6 sweets
 8 books
 10 crayons
 Practise sharing them between the two toys-each will have half the amount-you are sharing between 2.

Maths Lesson: 34 Sharing
 Collect 12 leaves
 Now share them out fairly between 2 minibeasts, 3 minibeasts, 4 minibeasts and 6 minibeasts.

Use a lollipop stick to make it into a puppet.
